Typography has been the subject of Year 5 art lessons and they have used their learning to create their names with their own unique typography.


We had a peek into the brains of Year 6 during their Art/PHSME lessons where they lifted the lid on their thoughts and interests.






#### Important information from the office



### **Talking Teens**

Talking Teens ~ is a free course for parents or carers of teenagers and pre-teens who are looking to better understand and communicate with their child. Talking Teens is a course that offers an opportunity to understand what's going on in the adolescent brain and how to understand your teens feelings and behaviours using an authoritative parenting style. Sessions will focus on relationships within the family, communication, negotiation, decision-making and strategies to reduce conflict.

Who would be eligible to attend this course?

- Parents and carers of pre-teens and teenagers who are currently in years 6 & 7 but there may be availability for years 5 & 8
- There is no physical or extremely challenging behaviour present in or outside of the family home. This course focuses on the importance of empathy and positive discipline
- Family must reside in Lewisham borough

The next course will be running on Tuesdays at Bellingham Family Hub on the following dates and times:

Tuesday 17th September 2024 – 10am-12pm Tuesday 24th September 2024 – 10am-12pm Tuesday 1st October 2024 – 10am-12pm Tuesday 8th October 2024 – 10am-12pm
